Our glass entrance door will be repaired this month and will become automatic. This will provide comfortable access for all, whether laden with shopping, pushing a buggy or managing with disability or impairment. At the same time it will keep in the warmth in winter.

Our warmest thanks to the Cambridgeshire Historic Churches Trust, the National Churches Trust and the Friends of Michaelhouse for making this possible. The work will not take place during opening hours so there will be the minimum of disruption, and we hope that you will enjoy the result.

## NEW CHAPEL FLOOR

Building works to level the chapel floor commence on 17 June. The new beautiful limestone floor and the removal of four pews will enable greater accessibility for those with disability, elderly or small children, and flexibility of purpose for community use. The Michaelhouse Chapel and the Hervey De Stanton chapel will reopen on 1 September.
